About James Holmes Armstead Jr.

Dr. J. Holmes Armstead is a retired professor of Strategy and International law from the U.S. Naval War College. He has taught international law, strategy, and national security policy for nearly 50 years.

Dr. Armstead received his undergraduate education at the University of Illinois in history and anthropology and graduated in 1968, receiving his J.D. in 1975 from DePaul University. He then returned to the University of Illinois, where he undertook graduate studies in public policy and economics and was awarded a Ph.D. in public policy analysis from Pacific Western University In 1981. Dr. Armstead also holds an advanced certificate in International Law from the Instituto Superiori Internationale Criminali Science in Siracusa, Italy and is the recipient of three honorary doctorates.

During his career, he served in the United Nations Secretariat, where he was the English language editor of the Treaty of Rome, which created the International Criminal Court at the Hague. He has served on missions with the Organization of Security and Cooperation in Europe (OSCE) as an international election observer in Belarus, the Ukraine, Kazakhstan and Kyrgyzstan. Jim served as an Armor, JAG, Inspector General and Civil Affairs Officer in the United States Army, the U.S. Army Reserves and National Guard in staff and command assignments from battalion to corps level, eventually serving in the Pentagon as a special assistant to the Secretary of the Army.
